

Max the Monkey's Division Dash

Learning objective: To practise dividing 2-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers and understanding division as sharing.

Hello! I am Max the Monkey. I love sharing bananas with my friends. Read each question carefully. Use the word bank if you get stuck. You can draw dots to help you share the amounts!

Answer Key: 1. A (5), 2. True, 3. 4, 4. 4, 5. C (8), 6. False, 7. 3, 8. B (9), 9. True, 10. 10. Max had 20 bananas, he shared them into 4 piles. 20 divided by 4 equals 5 bananas in each pile.

6. 6. True or False: 10 divided by 2 is 4. (1 mark)

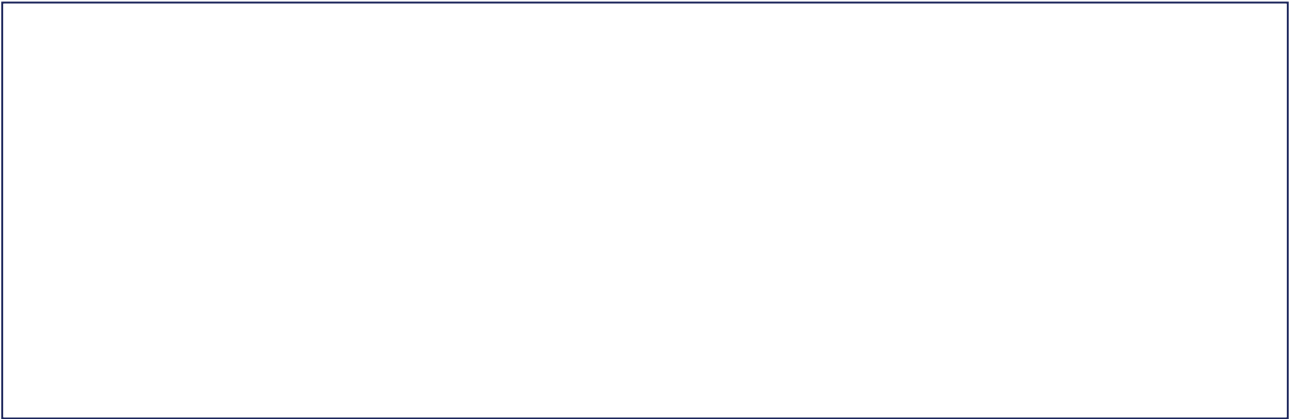
7. 7. Max has £9. He shares it between 3 monkeys. How many pounds (£) does each monkey get? (1 mark)

8. 8. What is 18 divided by 2? A) 7 B) 9* C) 8 D) 10 (1 mark)

9. 9. True or False: 20 divided by 5 is 4. (1 mark)

10. 10. Max has 20 bananas. He shares them into 4 piles. How many bananas are in one pile? (1 mark)

Draw: Draw 12 bananas in a bunch, then draw 3 monkeys and show how you would share the bananas equally between them.



Extension challenge: Max has 25 bananas. He shares them into 5 piles. How many are in each pile? Can you write it as a number sentence?
