

Max the Monkey's Easter Egg Shop

Learning objective: To solve one-step problems involving addition and subtraction of money using £ and p.

Help Max the Monkey manage his Easter stall! Use the prices provided to calculate totals and find the change. Write your working out clearly in the boxes below.

Word bank: total · change · pounds · pence · add · subtract · expensive · cheaper

1. The Easter Basket: If a chocolate bunny costs £3 and a decorated egg costs £2, what is the total cost for both items? Show your addition. (2 marks)

2. The Pocket Money Challenge: You have £10. You buy a giant egg for £7. How much change will you get back? Show your subtraction. (2 marks)

3. Comparing Prices: A bag of foil-wrapped eggs is £5. A single golden egg is £2. How much more does the bag of eggs cost than the golden egg? (2 marks)

4. Max's Special Offer: Max sells two small treats for £1 each. If you buy three treats, how much do you spend in total? (2 marks)

5. The Final Count: If you have a £5 note and a £2 coin, how much money do you have altogether to spend at the shop? (2 marks)

Extension challenge: Design your own Easter treat and give it a price in pounds (£). If a friend buys it with a £10 note, how much change would you give them?
