

Our Wonderful World of Friends

Learning objective: To understand that everyone is unique and that our differences make our community special.

Help Zara the zebra find friends who have different interests and skills. Look at the list of friends below. Draw a line to match each friend to the activity that they love, then think about what makes them special. Remember, we all like different things, and that is what makes our school a colourful place!

Word bank: Reading · Stargazing · Maths · Drawing · Swimming

1. Pip loves books. If Pip wanted to read a story with you, what is your favourite book to share? Why do you like it? (2 marks)

2. Max loves to solve puzzles. If you had £1 and wanted to buy a treat to share with a friend, what would you pick? (2 marks)

3. Nova loves the stars. What is one thing you can do that is different from your friends? (For example: dancing, running, or building). (2 marks)

4. Zara thinks patterns are beautiful. If you were drawing a picture of your friends, what colours would you use to show that everyone is different? (2 marks)

5. Finn explores the ocean. Why is it important to be kind to everyone, even if they like different things to you? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of yourself playing with your friends. Include at least two things you like to do that are different from each other, like one person playing with blocks and another person reading.
