

Max's Moral Choices

Learning objective: To think about moral choices and how our actions affect others.

Max the monkey has found some tricky situations! Read each situation below. Decide if the choice is a 'Kind Choice' or an 'Unkind Choice'. Write your answer in the box and tell us why you chose it. Use the word bank to help you.

Word bank: kind · unkind · helpful · honest · selfish · fair · thoughtful

1. Max finds a shiny coin worth £1 on the playground. He sees his friend drop it. Max keeps the coin. Is this a kind or unkind choice? Why? (2 marks)

2. Ellie the elephant is sad because she lost her favourite book. Max offers to help her look for it instead of playing his game. Is this a kind or unkind choice? Why? (2 marks)

3. Zara is painting a beautiful picture. Kit accidentally spills paint on it. Kit says sorry and helps Zara clean it up. Is this a kind or unkind choice? Why? (2 marks)

4. Pip the caterpillar is hungry. Max has two apples. He eats both and does not give one to Pip. Is this a kind or unkind choice? Why? (2 marks)
