

Making Good Choices: A Religious Education Assessment

Learning objective: To understand how we make moral choices and why it is important to be kind and fair.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you with your answers. Write your answers clearly on the lines provided.

Max the monkey and Leo the lion are friends. One day, Max finds a shiny red ball in the park. He knows it belongs to someone else. Max has a choice. He can keep the ball, or he can try to find the owner. Leo tells Max that being honest is important. They decide to ask people in the park if they lost a ball.

4. 4. What might happen if Max decided to keep the ball instead of returning it? (3 marks) (3 marks)

5. 5. Think about a time you had to make a kind choice. Describe what you did and why it was the right thing to do. Use the sentence starters: 'I chose to...' and 'It was the right thing because...'. (5 marks) (5 marks)
