4. How might a pilgrimage change a person's life or perspective? Start your paragraph by saying: Returning home after a pilgrimage can be a life-changing experience because... (3 marks)

5. Compare this to a journey you have taken. Start your paragraph by saying: My own journey was different to a pilgrimage because... (2 marks)

Extension challenge: Research a specific pilgrimage site, such as Lourdes, Varanasi, or Makkah. Write a short diary entry from the perspective of a pilgrim arriving at that location for the first time.
