- Remembrance Day is held every year on 11th November to remember the people who served in wars.
- The date marks the end of the First World War, which stopped at 11 o'clock on the 11th day of the 11th month in 1918.
- Many people choose to wear a red poppy as a sign of respect and to help raise money for veterans.
- At 11:00 am, many people join in a two-minute silence to think about those who have died in conflicts.
- The word 'Armistice' means an agreement to stop fighting.

Did you know? Did you know? The red poppy became a symbol of remembrance because it was one of the first flowers to grow in the ruined fields where battles had taken place during the First World War.
