

Nova's Space Exploration Assessment

Learning objective: To identify the planets in the solar system, understand the Earth's movement, and explain how day and night occur.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank if you need help. You can use a pencil to draw your diagrams.

Nova the owl is looking at the night sky. She knows that the Sun is at the centre of our solar system. The Earth moves around the Sun. The Earth also spins on its own axis. This helps us have day and night.

Word bank: Sun · Earth · Orbit · Rotate · Day · Night · Planet · Moon · Stars

2. The Earth takes one year to travel all the way around the Sun. What is this movement called? (2 marks) (2 marks)

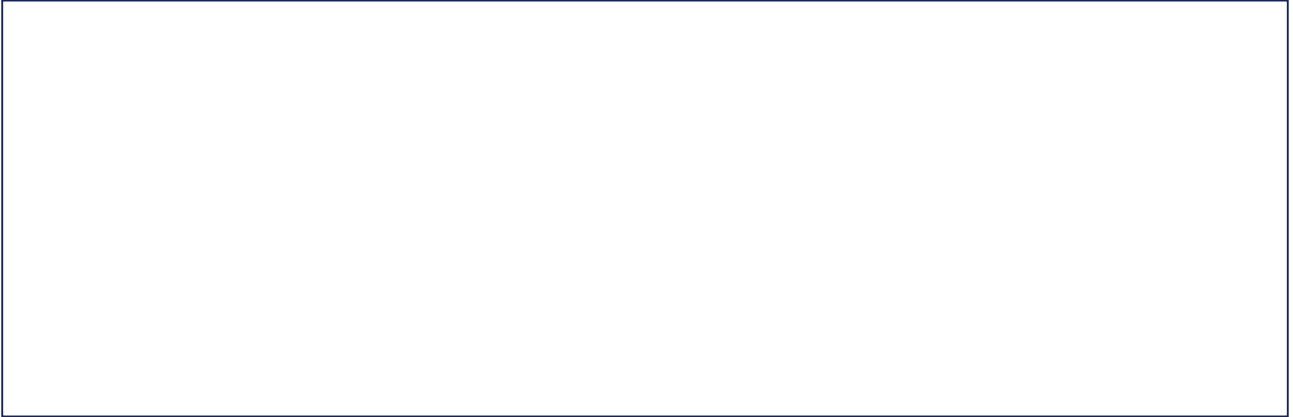
3. Explain why we have day and night on Earth. Use the words 'rotate' and 'Sun' in your answer. (4 marks) (4 marks)
