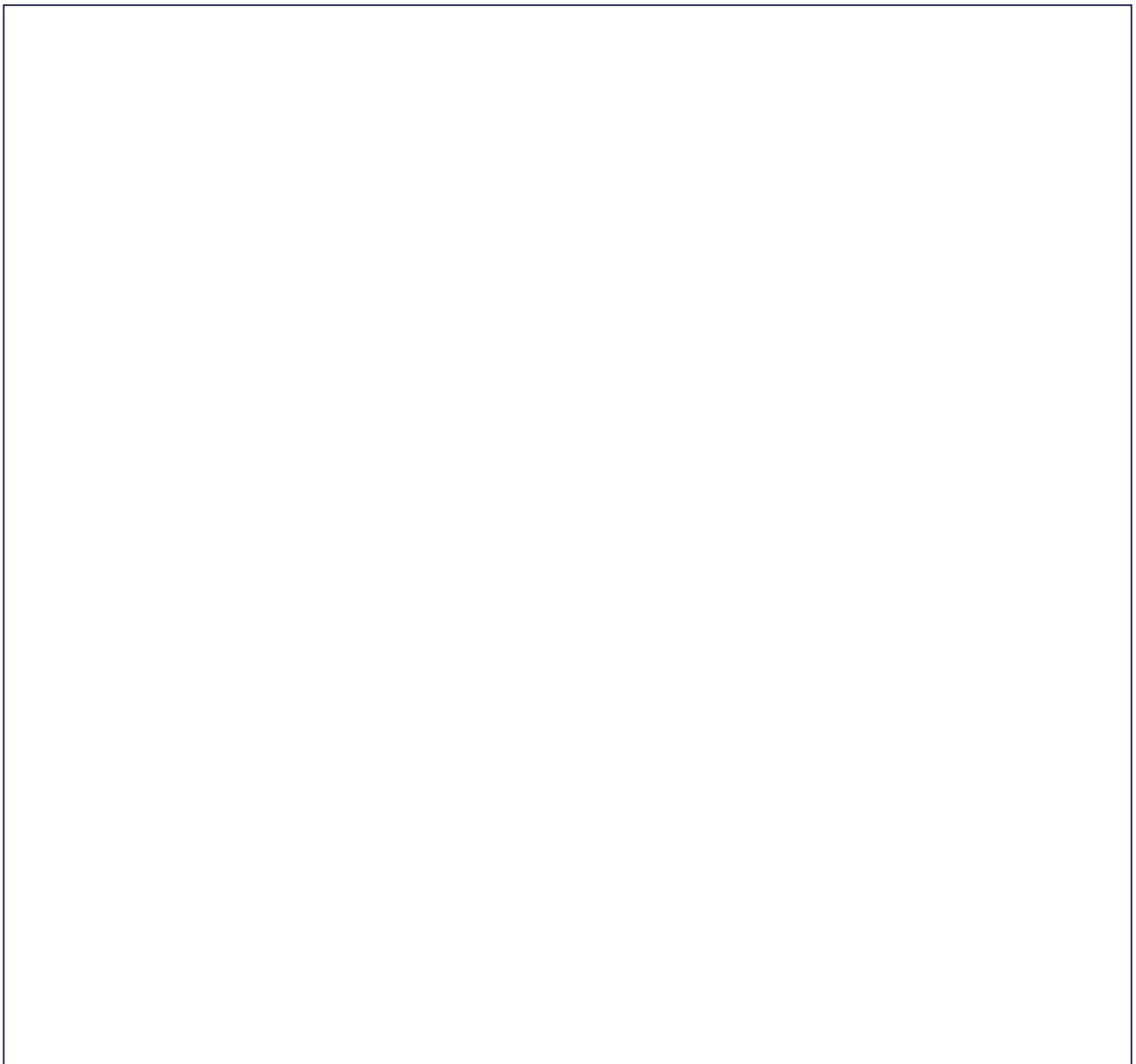


Zara's Diwali Rangoli Patterns

Learning objective: To explore symmetry, patterns, and cultural celebrations through art.

Look at the beautiful Rangoli pattern below. Use your brightest crayons or felt tips to colour in the shapes. Remember, Rangoli patterns are often symmetrical, which means they look the same on both sides! Zara the Zebra loves to use lots of different colours to make her designs pop.

Colour this: A large, symmetrical Rangoli pattern drawn in clear, thick black outlines on a white background. The centre is a large circle containing a star shape. Steps:

1. Label the circular shape in the centre of the pattern.
2. Label one of the flower petals on the outside edge.
