6. 6. True or False: You should only accept friend requests from people you know personally in the real world. (1 mark)

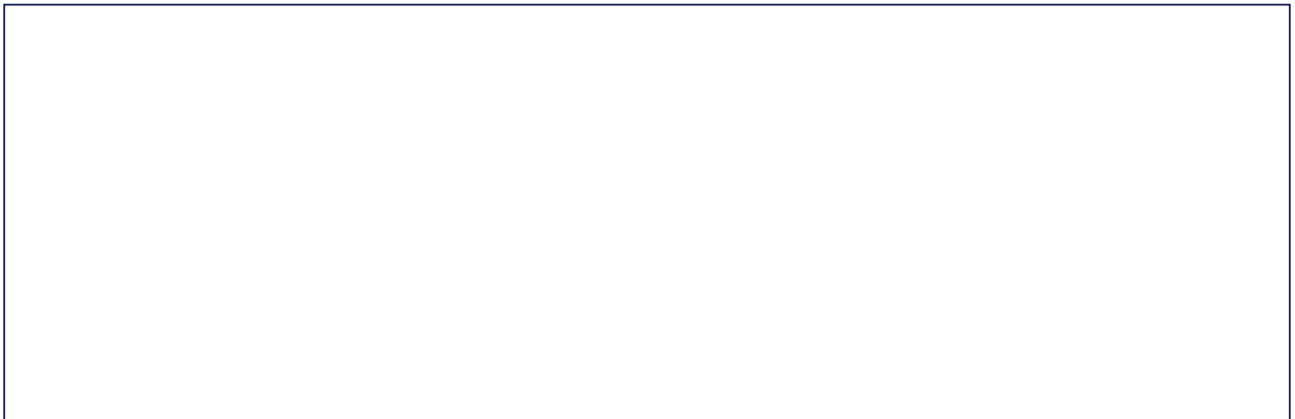
