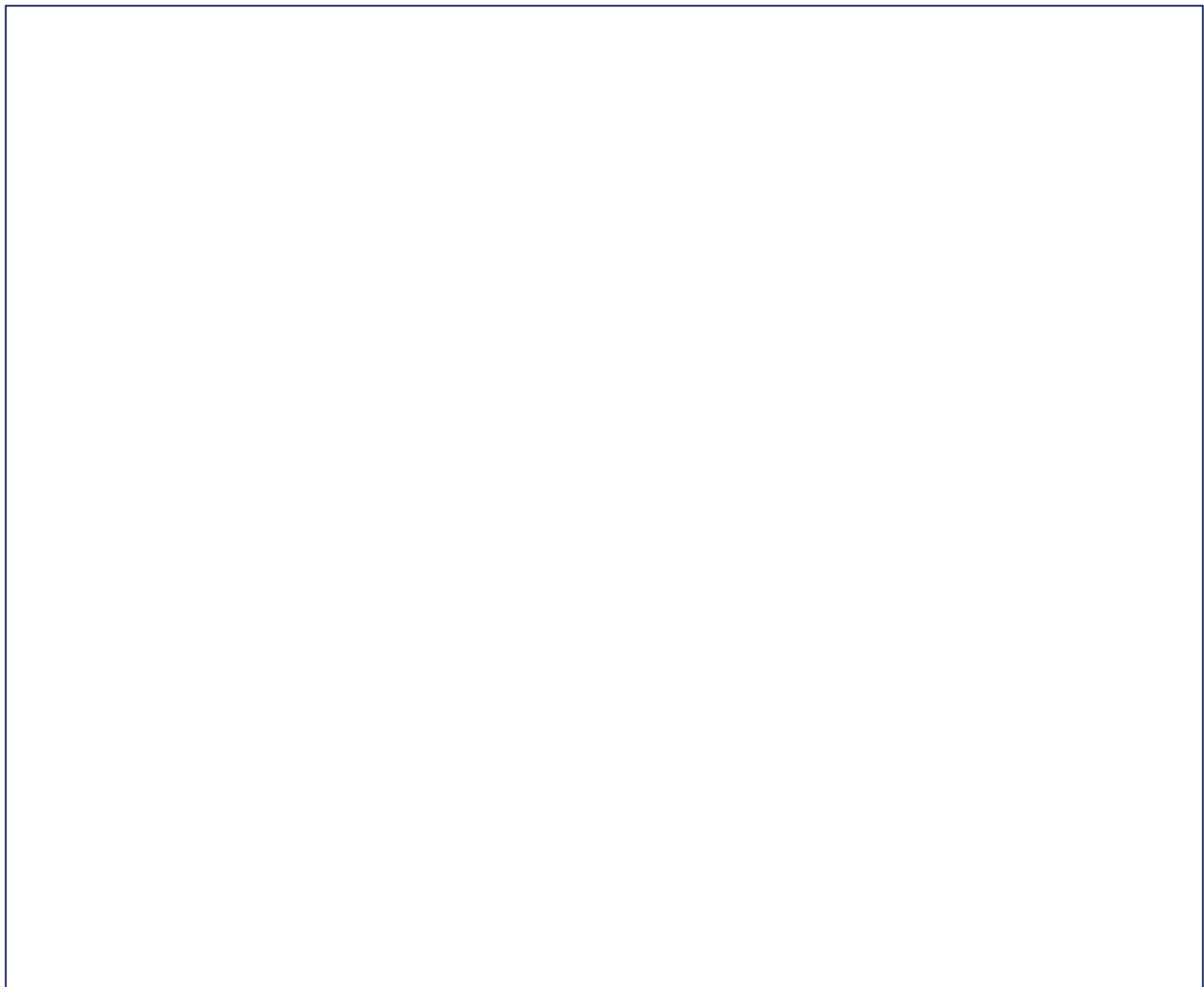


Kit's Digital Fortress: Staying Safe Online

Learning objective: To identify and illustrate key components of staying safe online, including strong passwords, privacy settings, and identifying suspicious content.

Help Kit the fox design a 'Digital Fortress' to protect his online identity. Follow the drawing steps below, label your diagram using the provided word bank, and answer the challenge questions to prove you are a savvy internet explorer.

Draw: Draw a large, friendly castle representing 'Kit's Digital Fortress'. Inside the main courtyard, draw Kit the fox working at a computer. Around the castle walls, draw a moat labelled 'Privacy Settings'. Add 'shield' icons on the castle turrets to represent 'Complex Passwords'. Outside the castle gates, draw a suspicious-looking path labelled 'Phishing Attempt' and show a 'Stop' sign near it. Use a clear, comic-book style with bold outlines and bright, friendly colours.
