- Natural fibres, such as cotton and wool, are harvested from plants or animals, whereas synthetic fabrics like polyester are created through chemical processes in factories.
- A template is a vital tool for accuracy; it ensures that every piece of fabric is cut to the exact size required for your design before you begin joining.
- The seam allowance is the space between the raw edge of the fabric and the line of stitches, providing the necessary strength to prevent the seams from fraying or pulling apart.
- Appliqué is a decorative technique where smaller pieces of fabric are layered and stitched onto a larger base fabric to create detailed patterns or images.
- When choosing a fabric, designers must consider tensile strength; this determines how much force a material can withstand before it stretches out of shape or tears.

Did you know? Did you know? The oldest known piece of fabric dates back over 30,000 years! Ancient humans used flax fibres to create simple cords and textiles long before the invention of the modern sewing machine.
