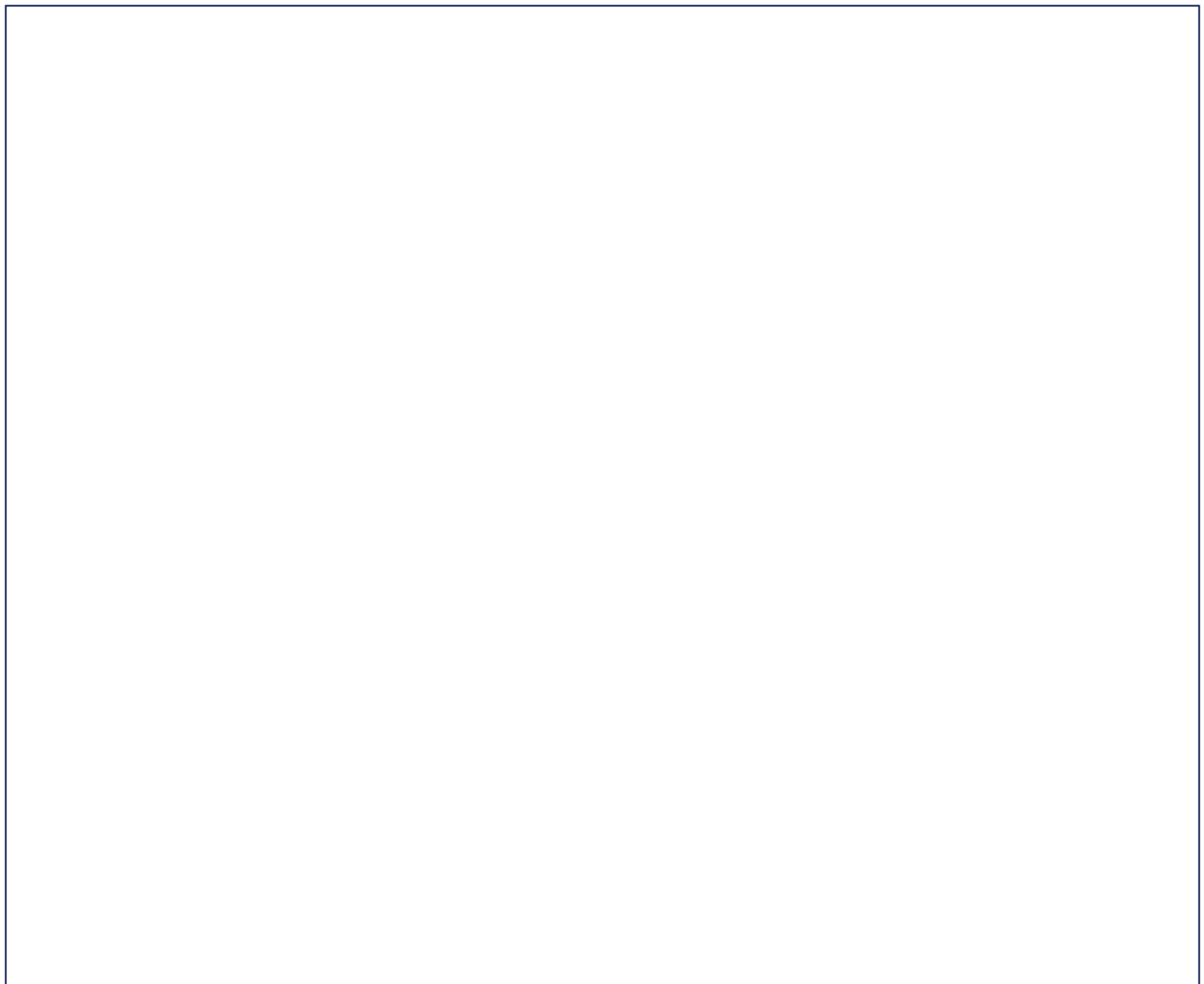


Black History Month: Celebrating Trailblazers

Learning objective: To identify and illustrate the contributions of significant historical figures, using artistic expression to convey their impact on society.

Today, we are joined by Ellie the elephant, who remembers the stories of those who changed the world. Choose one historical figure who has made a positive impact on British or global society. Use the space provided to create a commemorative portrait or a scene depicting their greatest achievement.

Draw: Draw a commemorative portrait or a narrative scene in the centre of your page. Use a clear, illustrative style similar to a biography poster. Include the person in the foreground. In the background, incorporate symbols or patterns that represent their achievements (e.g., if drawing an inventor, include sketches of their designs; if drawing a poet, include swirling text and ink quills). Ensure your drawing is framed by a border featuring at least four vocabulary words from the word bank written in elegant script.

Steps:

1. Identify your chosen historical figure and explain why their work is still relevant in society today.
2. Choose three words from the word bank and justify how they relate to your chosen figure's life.
3. Compare and contrast the challenges this person faced with the opportunities we have today.

4. What might happen if this person had not pursued their goals? Explain the potential impact on history.
5. Label your drawing with at least four items that represent the person's specific field of work (e.g., a microphone for a musician, a microscope for a scientist).
6. If you could ask this person one question about their journey, what would it be and why?
