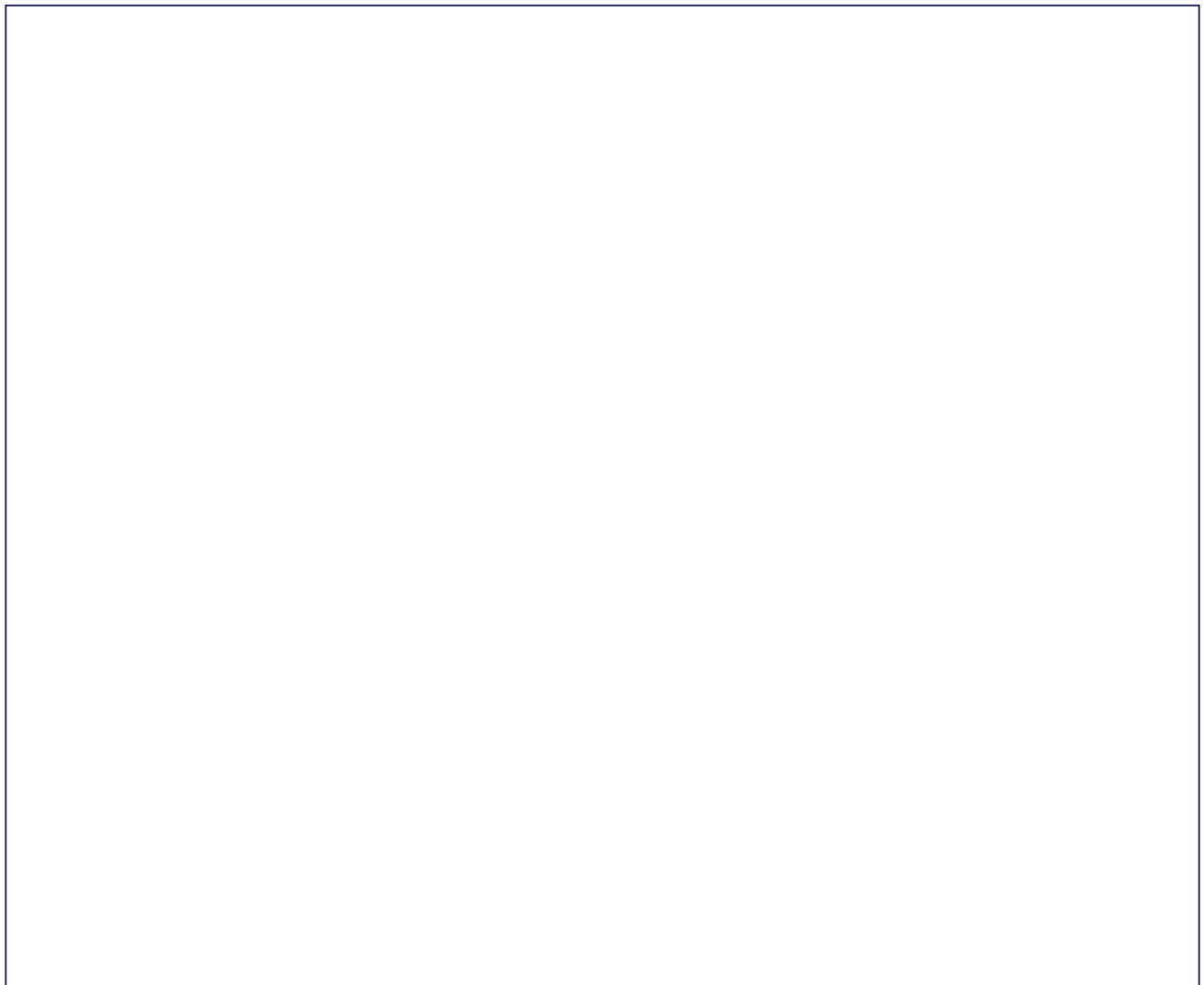


Bonfire Night Illustration Challenge

Learning objective: To use descriptive language and visual representation to explore the sensory details and historical context of Bonfire Night.

Follow the drawing prompts carefully to create your own Bonfire Night scene. Use your best artistic skills to add detail, colour, and texture to your work. Once finished, use the labels from the word bank to annotate your drawing.

Draw: Create a nocturnal scene featuring a large, crackling bonfire. Draw the flames using bright oranges, reds, and yellows. Include Nova the owl watching from a wooden fence in the foreground. In the dark night sky above, add several colourful fireworks with trails of light. Use a silhouette style for the trees in the background to make the fire look brighter.



Label words: flickering flames · glowing embers · vibrant sparks · night sky · crackling fire · silhouette

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a large bonfire in the centre of your page. Describe one sound you might hear if you were standing next to it.
2. Step 2: Draw Nova the owl perched on a nearby fence watching the fireworks. What colours would you use to show the light reflecting in her eyes?
3. Step 3: Label your drawing using at least three words from the word bank to show the different parts of the

bonfire and the sky.

4. Step 4: Think about the history of Bonfire Night. Why do we celebrate this event on the 5th of November? Write one sentence.

5. Step 5: If you were selling a warm cup of hot chocolate at the bonfire, and it cost £1.50, how much change would you give from a £2.00 coin?
