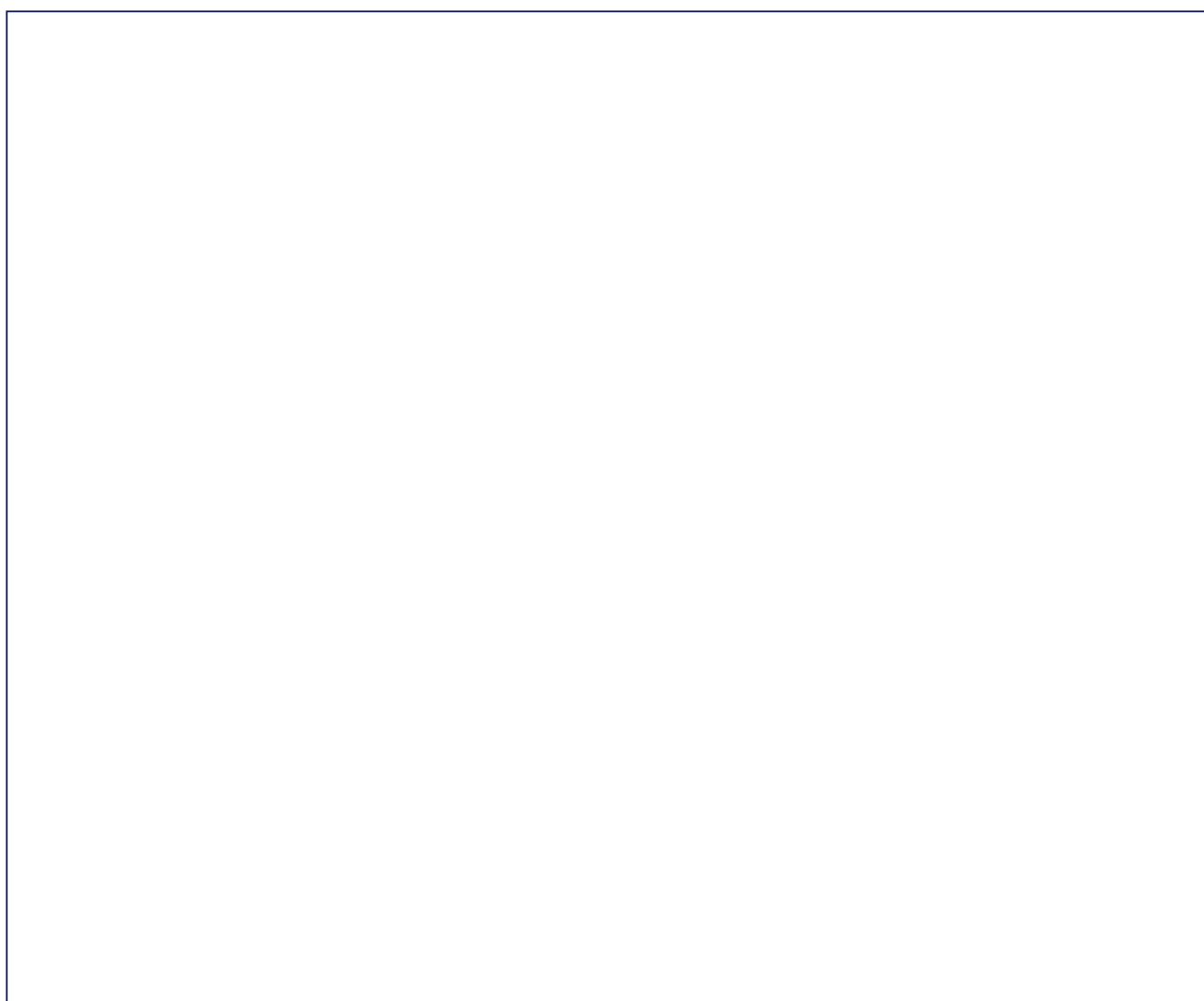


Design Your Own Book Review Poster

Learning objective: To create an engaging and persuasive visual review of a book, identifying key structural elements such as plot summaries, character descriptions, and personal recommendations.

Use this sheet to plan a creative poster for a book you have recently enjoyed. Think about how to grab a reader's attention using pictures and words. Ensure your layout is clear and includes your honest opinion.

Draw: Create a rectangular frame on your page to act as your poster border. Inside, draw a detailed scene from your book's main setting. Use bold lines for the focal point and lighter shading for the background. Include a prominent 'Title' area at the top using bubble or block lettering. Integrate your written review around the central image so that the text and drawings complement each other. Use Zara's approach to art: look for patterns in your drawing to make the poster stand out.



Label words: Genre · Plot summary · Protagonist · Setting · Recommendation · Rating · Climax · Captivating

Steps:

1. Step 1: In the space provided, draw a scene that represents the 'hook' or the most exciting part of your book. What specific detail will you include to show the genre?
2. Step 2: Label your drawing with three words from the word bank that describe the atmosphere of your book.

3. Step 3: Write a short, persuasive 'blurb' at the bottom of your poster. Why should another Year 6 student read this book?
4. Step 4: Create a visual 'star rating' system for your book (e.g., 5 out of 5 stars). Draw this in the corner of your poster.
5. Step 5: Identify the 'Protagonist' of your book. Draw a small portrait of them in the margin and write one adjective to describe their personality.
