

Year 3 Easter Story Flashcards with Pip the Bookworm

Learning objective: To understand the key events and vocabulary associated with the Easter story within a religious education context.

Use these flashcards to test your knowledge of the Easter story. Read the term on the left, then flip to check the answer on the right. Pip the Bookworm wants to see how many you can get right!

What happened on Palm Sunday?

This is the day Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey and people welcomed him by waving palm branches.

What was the Last Supper?

The final meal that Jesus shared with his twelve closest friends, known as his disciples.

What is a disciple?

A student or a loyal follower of a teacher or religious leader.

Which city is the main setting for the Easter story?

Jerusalem.

What is the significance of Good Friday?

This is the day that marks the crucifixion of Jesus.

What does the word 'Resurrection' mean?

The belief that Jesus rose from the dead on the third day after his death.

What do Christians celebrate on Easter Sunday?

The Resurrection of Jesus, which symbolises hope and new life.

Why did people wave palm branches in the story?

It was a traditional way to show honour and welcome to a King or a special visitor.

Who was one of the key locations mentioned in the story besides the city gates?

The Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus went to pray.

What is the name of the tomb where Jesus was laid?

A stone-hewn sepulchre or tomb.
