

The Easter Story: Illustrating Traditions

Learning objective: To demonstrate understanding of the Easter narrative and its cultural symbolism through creative visual representation and descriptive labelling.

Use the drawing space provided to create a detailed scene representing the story of Easter. Think about the symbols of new life and reflection. Use the word bank to label your illustration accurately.

Draw: Create a landscape scene that captures the essence of Easter. Include a foreground with spring flowers or budding trees to show renewal. In the middle ground, include a subtle architectural element or path that leads the eye toward the horizon. Use shading to create a calm, reflective atmosphere. Ensure your drawing is balanced and use the word bank terms to add clear, neat labels around your composition.



Label words: Spring · Renewal · Reflection · Symbolism · Tradition · Landscape · Celebration

Steps:

1. Explain why you chose specific colours for your drawing and how they represent the themes of the Easter story.
2. Step 1: Draw a central focal point that represents 'new beginnings'. Describe what you have drawn below.
3. Label the [Horizon line] on your drawing to show depth and perspective.
4. How does your illustration show the passage of time or the change in seasons?

5. Identify one piece of symbolism in your drawing and explain its significance to the Easter theme.
