

Non-Chronological Report: The Wonders of Our World

Learning objective: To organise information into a non-chronological report using subheadings, technical vocabulary, and formal tone.

Use this template to research and write a report on a fascinating topic. Remember to use a clear, informative title and organise your facts into logical paragraphs. Use the word bank to help you include higher-level vocabulary. Ensure your writing is objective and factual.

1. Introduction: Provide a general classification of your chosen subject and explain why it is considered noteworthy. (3 marks)

2. Subheading 1: Describe the primary habitat or environment. Explain how the subject has adapted to survive here. (4 marks)

3. Subheading 2: Detail the physical characteristics or specific behaviours. Compare and contrast these features with similar subjects. (4 marks)

4. Interesting Facts: List three fascinating, lesser-known pieces of information about your subject. (3 marks)

5. Justification: Why is it important for humans to learn about this subject? Justify your answer using evidence from your research. (4 marks)

6. Evaluation: What might happen to this subject if its environment were to change drastically? Explain your reasoning. (4 marks)

Extension challenge: Imagine you are Max the monkey investigating a new species. Write a persuasive paragraph explaining why this subject deserves a place in a natural history museum. Use formal language and include at least two relative clauses.
