

Year 6 Spelling Masterclass with Pip the Bookworm

Learning objective: To practise and master common Year 5/6 spelling patterns, including silent letters, suffix rules, and homophones.

Use these flashcards to test your spelling knowledge! Read the front of the card, try to spell the word or answer the question, then check the back (the answer) to see how you did. Pip the Bookworm suggests saying the words aloud to help remember them.

Spell the word that means 'to provide space or lodging for someone'. Hint: It has a double 'c' and a double 'm'. accommodate	Spell the word that means 'aware of and responding to one's surroundings'. conscious
Which word for a part of the body contains a 'ch' that sounds like a 'k'? stomach	Spell the homophone that means 'a passage between rows of seats'. aisle
Spell the word that means 'certain or clearly defined'. definite	Spell the word for the electrical discharge seen during a storm. lightning
Spell the word for a place where people are buried. cemetery	Spell the word for a line of people waiting for something. queue
Spell the word that relates to the body rather than the mind. physical	Spell the word that means a correspondence of sound between words or the endings of words. rhyme
Add the suffix '-ious' to the word 'space'. spacious	What is the rule for adding a suffix to a word ending in 'y' after a consonant? Change the 'y' to an 'i' before adding the suffix (e.g., happy -> happiness).
