What is a 'Character'?	Where and when a story takes place is known as the...?
A person, animal, or creature who takes part in the action of a story.	The Setting.
What do we call the 'Plot' of a story?	What is 'Dialogue' in a story?
The sequence of events that make up the story from beginning to end.	The words spoken by the characters, usually shown inside speech marks.
What is the 'Resolution' of a story?	What is a 'Narrator'?
The part at the end where the problems are solved and the story concludes.	The person or voice telling the story to the reader.
What is 'Conflict' in a narrative?	What is the purpose of an 'Adjective' in storytelling?
A problem or struggle that the main character must face.	To describe a noun, helping the reader picture the characters and setting more clearly.
What is the 'Theme' of a story?	Why do we use 'Paragraphs' in a story?
The main idea or the message that the author wants to share, like friendship or bravery.	To group related sentences together and show a change in time, place, or speaker.
