- The setting tells the reader where and when the story takes place, such as in a dark forest or on a faraway planet.
- The plot is the sequence of events, including an exciting problem that the characters must try to solve.
- Dialogue uses speech marks to show exactly what a character is saying out loud to others.
- The resolution is the very end of the story where we find out how the problem was fixed and how the characters feel.

Did you know? Did you know? The oldest written story in the world is called The Epic of Gilgamesh. It was carved onto clay tablets in ancient Mesopotamia over 4,000 years ago, long before paper books were invented!
