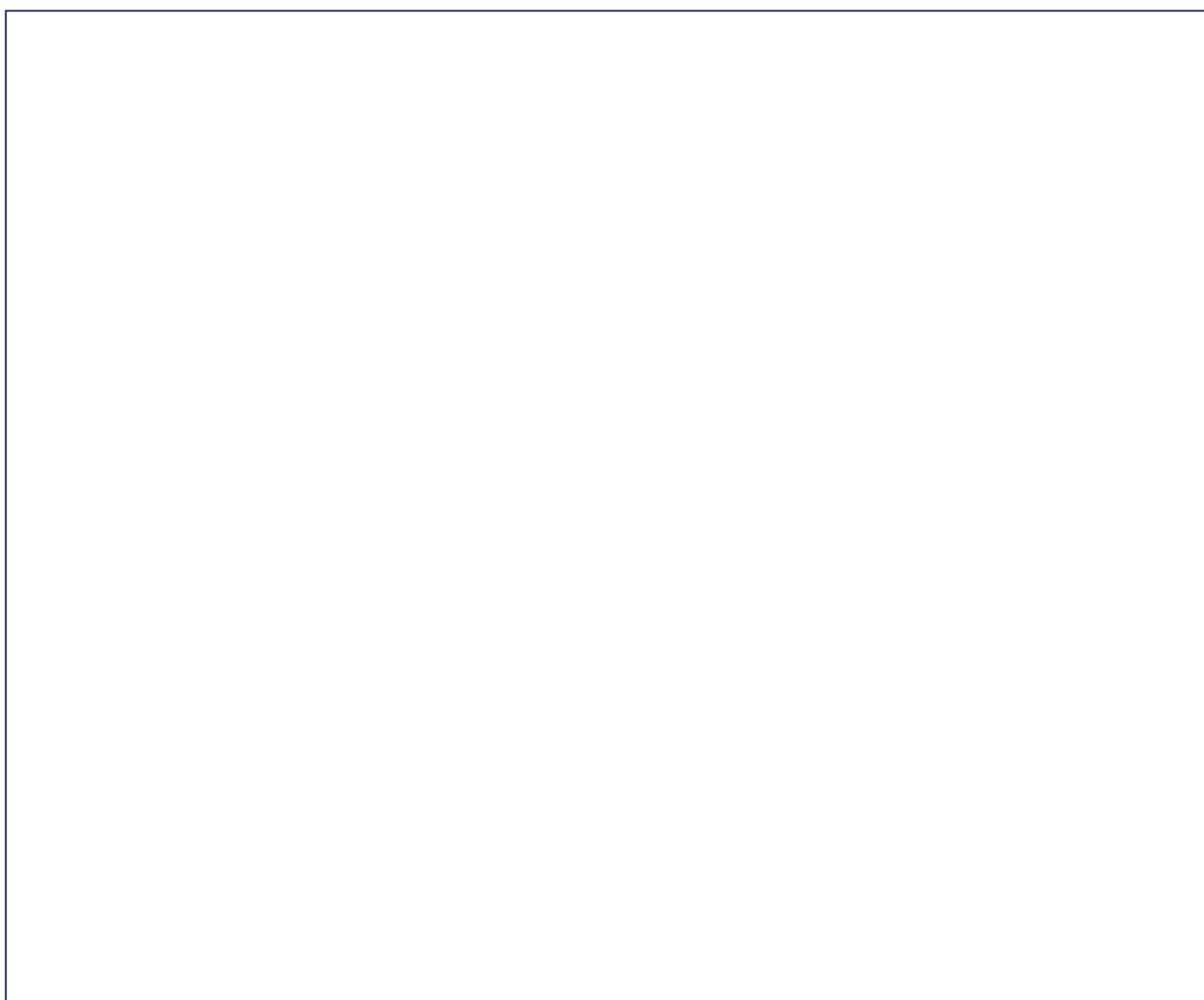


Pip's Magnificent Vocabulary Garden

Learning objective: To use descriptive and ambitious vocabulary to enhance visual storytelling and characterisation.

Pip the bookworm caterpillar is building a garden where words grow like flowers! Use your imagination to draw this magical place. Use the word bank to label your drawing and add descriptive captions to show how the words look and feel.

Draw: Draw a lush, magical garden scene from a bird's-eye view. Include a 'towering' tree where the leaves are shaped like open books. Ensure Pip the caterpillar is visible, perhaps wearing a tiny hat or magnifying glass. Use a colourful, artistic style—think of vibrant watercolours or detailed ink sketches. Ensure there is plenty of space around your drawing to add labels and descriptive sentences from the word bank.



Label words: Vibrant · Towering · Luminous · Fragrant · Glistening · Whimsical · Sprawling

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a 'towering' word-tree in the centre of your page. Label the leaves with three synonyms for the word 'big'.
2. Step 2: Draw Pip sitting on a 'glistening' leaf. Describe how Pip is feeling using one adjective from the word bank and one of your own.

3. Step 3: Draw a 'whimsical' path winding through the garden. Label the path with a noun phrase that uses an expanded noun phrase (e.g., The golden, winding path of stories).
4. Step 4: Add a 'fragrant' flower to your garden. Write a short sentence explaining what scent it gives off, using a fronted adverbial (e.g., Sweetly and softly, the flower...).
5. Step 5: Look at your drawing. Choose one object you have drawn and write a metaphor to describe it (e.g., The dew drops were tiny, liquid diamonds).
