

World Book Day Adventure with Pip

Learning objective: To identify and use descriptive language and show understanding of the purpose and celebration of World Book Day.

Read each question carefully and answer in full sentences where possible. Use the word bank to help you express your ideas about books and reading.

Pip the bookworm is getting ready for World Book Day! Pip loves to travel to new worlds through pages and wants you to think about why reading is so special.

Word bank: imagination · adventure · character · favourite · celebrate · storyteller · knowledge · vocabulary

1. World Book Day is a time to celebrate reading. Why do you think it is important to have a special day just for books? (2 marks)

2. If you could step into any book for one day, what would the setting look like? Use two adjectives to describe it. (2 marks)

3. Pip is collecting new words. Can you write a sentence about your favourite book using at least one word from the word bank? (2 marks)

4. Imagine you are dressing up as a character from a book. Which character would you choose and why do you admire them? (2 marks)

5. If a book costs £5.50 and a special bookmark costs £1.20, how much would you spend altogether on these items for World Book Day? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Pip the bookworm sitting on a giant, open book. Around Pip, draw three items that represent your favourite story (for example, a magic key, a space helmet, or a dragon's scale).



Extension challenge: Write a short poem (4-6 lines) about why you love reading, just like Leo the lion does. Try to include one rhyme!
