

Rosa's Body Parts Challenge: Le Corps Humain

Learning objective: To identify and spell common French vocabulary for parts of the human body and apply them in descriptive sentences.

Rosa the parrot has prepared a diagram of a robot she is building! Your task is to label the parts of the robot using the French word bank. Once labelled, use your knowledge to answer the deeper thinking questions below to help Rosa refine her design.

Word bank: la tête · le bras · la main · la jambe · le pied · le ventre · l'œil · le nez

1. If Rosa's robot needs to walk across a bumpy forest floor, explain why it is essential for the robot to have 'le pied' and 'la jambe'. (2 marks)

2. Compare and contrast the function of 'l'œil' and 'le nez' in terms of how a robot might interact with its environment. (2 marks)

3. Rosa wants to add a second 'bras' to her robot. Justify why having two limbs is more efficient than having only one for picking up objects. (2 marks)

4. What might happen if the robot's 'tête' was positioned on its 'ventre' instead of at the top of the body? Consider the implications for movement and balance. (2 marks)

5. Translate this sentence into French: 'The robot has a big head and a small hand.' (2 marks)

6. If each part of the robot costs £15 to build, calculate the total cost for a robot with two arms, two legs, and two feet. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw Rosa's robot on a separate sheet of paper. Clearly label each body part in French using the vocabulary from the word bank. Add one creative accessory (like a hat or a scarf) and label it using a descriptive French adjective if you know one!



Extension challenge: Write a short poem in French (or a mix of French and English) describing your robot's daily routine. Use at least four body part nouns and include one action verb for each part (e.g., 'Le pied marche', 'La main attrape').
