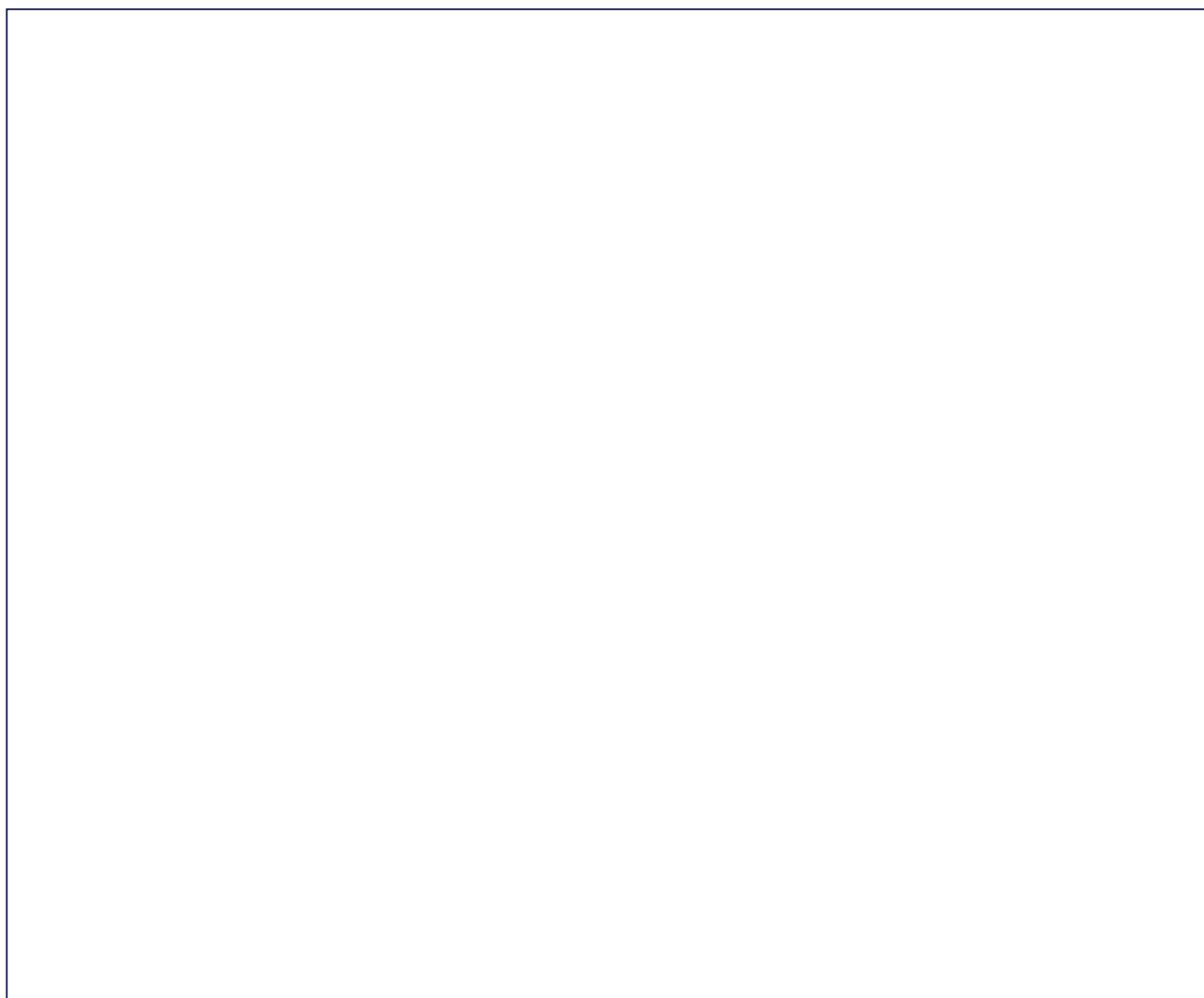


Rosa's Creative Creature Lab: French Body Parts

Learning objective: To identify and label parts of the human body in French, and to apply this knowledge to create a labelled scientific diagram.

Follow the drawing prompt to create your own unique creature. Once finished, use the word bank to label the correct body parts in French. Remember to use the correct articles (le, la, les) where appropriate.

Draw: Draw a fantastical, friendly creature in the centre of your page. Your creature should have a distinct head, at least two arms with hands, two legs with feet, and a visible back. Use a fine-liner or pencil to create clean, scientific-style labels pointing to each body part. Ensure your creature looks like a kind forest dweller that Rosa might meet on her travels.



Label words: la tête (head) · les yeux (eyes) · le nez (nose) · la bouche (mouth) · les oreilles (ears) · le bras (arm) · la main (hand) · la jambe (leg) · le pied (foot) · le dos (back)

Steps:

1. Label the creature's head and ears using the correct French terminology from the word bank.
2. Identify and label the creature's arms and hands in French.
3. Explain why it is important to include the correct gender article (le or la) when learning French nouns.
4. Compare and contrast: How would the label 'les yeux' change if the creature only had one eye? Justify your answer using French grammar rules.

5. If you were to add wings to your creature, what French noun might you use for 'wing'? (Hint: Look for patterns in feminine nouns ending in -e).

6. What might happen to the sentence structure if you wanted to describe the size of the body parts (e.g., 'The big nose')? Provide an example.
