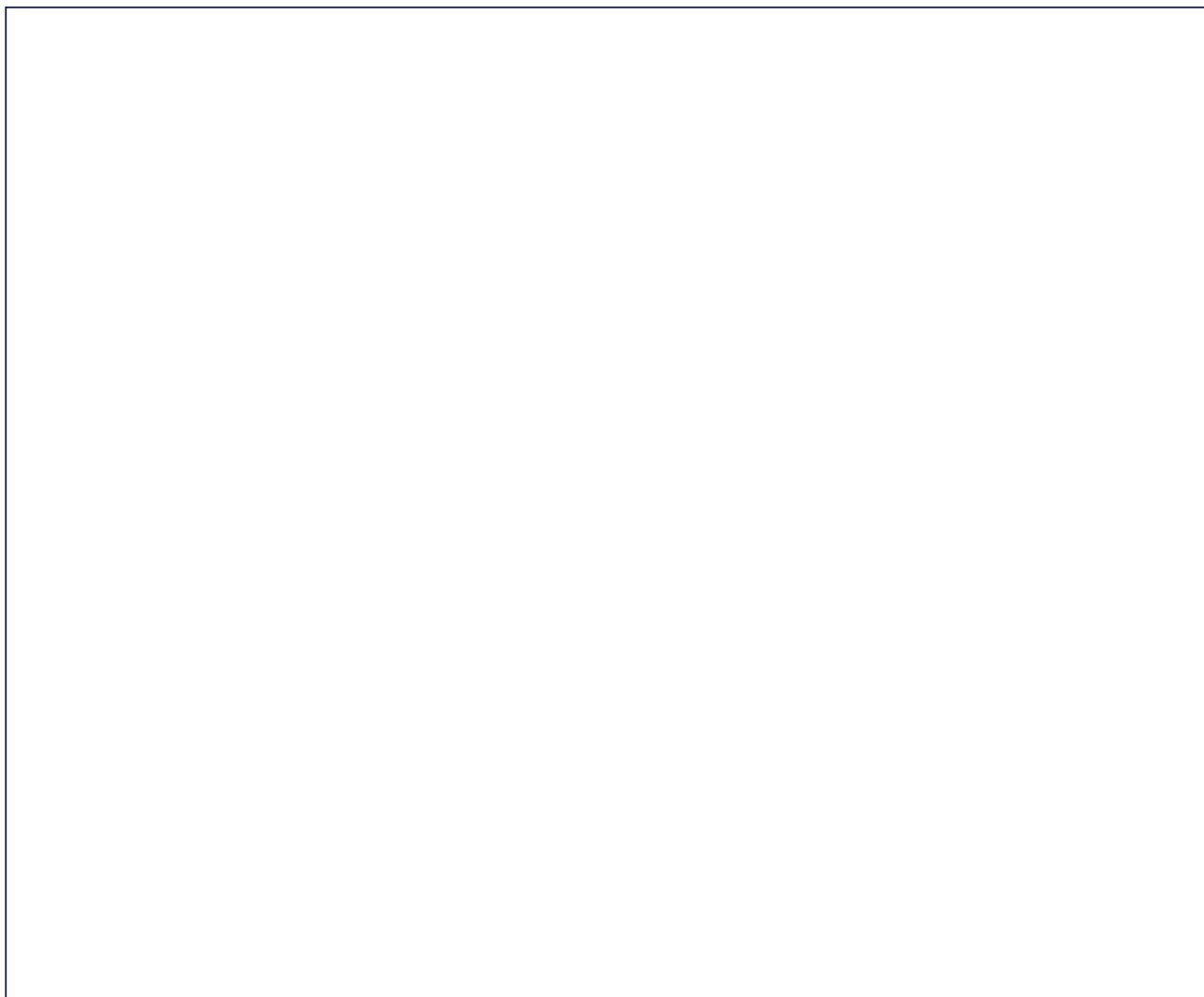


Rosa's Parisian Fashion Boutique

Learning objective: To identify and label items of clothing in French and use descriptive adjectives to express personal style.

Help Rosa the parrot prepare for her fashion show! Use the word bank to label the clothing items on your drawing, then complete the questions to describe your outfit choice.

Draw: Draw Rosa the parrot standing in the centre of a bright, cheerful boutique. She is hosting a fashion show! Draw an outfit on Rosa using at least four items from the word bank. Ensure the drawing is detailed, showing the texture of the fabric (e.g., woolly jumpers or shiny shoes). Add a price tag to one item using the £ symbol to show how much it costs.



Label words: un chapeau (a hat) · une chemise (a shirt) · un pantalon (trousers) · une robe (a dress) · des chaussures (shoes) · un manteau (a coat) · un pull (a jumper) · une jupe (a skirt)

Steps:

1. Choose one item from your drawing. Write a French sentence describing its colour. (Example: La robe est rouge.)
2. If you were going to the seaside in France, which three items from the word bank would you pack? Justify your choice.
3. Compare and contrast: Why might a person choose to wear 'un manteau' in winter but not in summer?

Explain the importance of seasonal clothing.

4. What might happen if someone wore 'des chaussures' to go swimming? Explain your reasoning.

5. Design a new accessory for Rosa. Draw it on your character and write a French label for it.

6. Justify your answer: Is it more important for clothing to be stylish or practical? Use examples from your drawing to support your argument.
