Learning objective: To identify and use French vocabulary for items of clothing, applying accurate gendered articles (un/une).

Join Rosa the parrot as she prepares for a fashion show! Read each question carefully. Choose the correct French term for the clothing items described. Remember to look for the correct gendered articles.

What might happen if you used the wrong article in a French sentence? 5. If Rosa buys a shirt for £12.50 and a hat for £7.25, write a French sentence describing what she bought and the total cost. 6. Describe your perfect outfit in French, including colours, and explain why you chose those specific items.
