

Les Jours de la Semaine avec Rosa

Join Rosa the Parrot on a linguistic adventure—master the French days of the week and bring your calendar to life!

- The sequence always begins with **Lundi**, as the French school week traditionally starts on a Monday.
- Remember that French days of the week are masculine nouns; we use 'le' before them to mean 'on' (e.g., 'le lundi' = on Mondays).
- To ask 'What day is it?', we say 'Quel jour sommes-nous?'
- The weekend, known as 'le week-end', consists of samedi and dimanche.
- Practise your pronunciation by linking the final sounds to the next word, a technique called 'liaison'.

Did you know? Did you know? In French, the days of the week are not written with a capital letter unless they start a sentence! They are also inspired by the solar system: 'Lundi' comes from 'Lune' (Moon), 'Mardi' from 'Mars', 'Mercredi' from 'Mercury', 'Jeudi' from 'Jupiter', and 'Vendredi' from 'Venus'.
