

La Famille: Meet Rosa's Family!

Join Rosa the Parrot on a flight through the family tree—uncover the French words for the people who make your world special!

- The French word for 'father' is 'père'. If you wanted to say 'my father', you would use the phrase 'mon père'.
- The French word for 'mother' is 'mère'. To say 'my mother', you use the feminine possessive adjective: 'ma mère'.
- To describe your siblings, use 'mon frère' for a brother and 'ma sœur' for a sister.
- Your grandparents are 'mon grand-père' (grandfather) and 'ma grand-mère' (grandmother).
- To talk about both parents together, we use the plural term 'les parents'.

Did you know? Did you know? In French, we use 'mon' (my) for masculine nouns like 'père' and 'frère', but we switch to 'ma' for feminine nouns like 'mère' and 'sœur'. It is like a secret code for the gender of the words!
