

Rosa's Le Petit Café Menu Challenge

Learning objective: To identify and categorise French vocabulary related to food and drink, and to construct simple sentences expressing preferences using 'j'aime' or 'je n'aime pas'.

Rosa the parrot is opening a bilingual café! Help her organise the menu by sorting the items into the correct categories below. Then, use the word bank to write sentences about what you would like to order and explain why.

Word bank: le pain · la pomme · le chocolat chaud · le fromage · la salade · le jus d'orange · le croissant · la fraise

1. Sort the word bank items into two groups: 'Les aliments' (food) and 'Les boissons' (drinks). (4 marks)

2. Write a sentence in French starting with 'J'aime...' to describe one item from the menu. Then, justify your choice in English. (3 marks)

3. Write a sentence in French starting with 'Je n'aime pas...' to describe an item. Explain why you might prefer a different option. (3 marks)

4. Compare and contrast: Why is it important to have a balance of different food groups on a menu? Mention one item from the list as part of a healthy meal. (4 marks)

5. If a customer has £5.00, and a croissant costs £1.50 and a hot chocolate costs £2.00, calculate the total. How much change would they receive? (3 marks)

6. What might happen if Rosa decided to remove all the healthy fruit options from her café menu? Justify your answer using your knowledge of a balanced diet. (4 marks)

Draw: Draw a plate of food for Rosa's café. Label at least three items in French and add a price tag in pounds and pence (£) for each item.



Extension challenge: Design a full 'Menu du Jour' for the café. Include at least one starter, one main course, and one dessert. Write the names in French, add the prices in £, and write a persuasive blurb in English describing why customers should visit Rosa's café.
