

Rosa's Radiant Greetings: Bonjour, mes amis!

Master the art of conversation with Rosa the Parrot—let's get chatting in French!

- **Bonjour** is used throughout the day to greet someone politely. Why might you choose this over the word 'Salut'?
- When you ask 'Comment ça va?', you are enquiring about someone's well-being. It is a fundamental building block of social interaction.
- **Enchanté** is a useful phrase to remember when you are introduced to someone new for the very first time.
- To be polite when asking for something, always add 'S'il vous plaît' to the end of your sentence.
- **Au revoir** is the standard way to say goodbye, whereas 'À bientôt' implies that you expect to see the person again in the near future.

Did you know? Did you know? In France, it is common to use 'vous' when speaking to people you don't know well or in formal settings, like with a teacher. 'Tu' is only used for family and close friends! This is called the 'registre de langue', and choosing the right one shows great respect.
