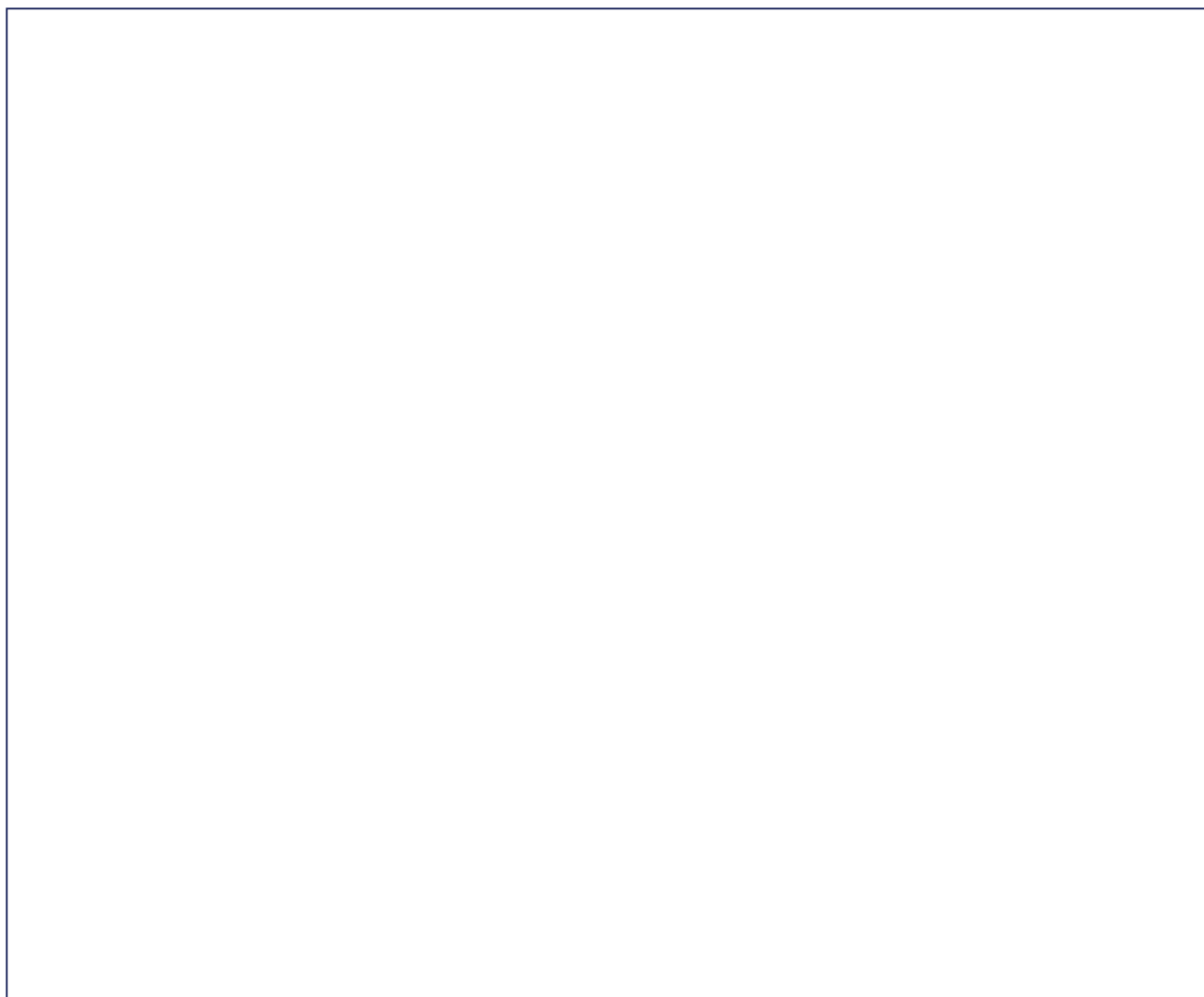


Rosa's Number Market Adventure

Learning objective: To recall and apply French vocabulary for numbers 1 to 50 within a creative context.

Rosa the parrot has opened a vibrant market stall! Use the vocabulary in the word bank to label the items Rosa is selling. Make sure you use the correct number and the corresponding French word for each item you draw.

Draw: Draw a busy market stall scene from the perspective of Rosa the parrot. Include a wooden counter covered in various items: baskets of apples, stacks of books, and bunches of flowers. In the style of a colourful, detailed comic-book illustration, add speech bubbles for Rosa. Ensure there is plenty of space around the items for you to draw labels and write the French number words clearly next to each group of objects.



Label words: un, deux, trois, quatre, cinq, dix, vingt, trente, quarante, cinquante · pommes (apples) · livres (books) · stylos (pens) · fleurs (flowers)

Steps:

1. Rosa is selling 12 apples. Write the French phrase for 'twelve apples' and draw 12 small circles in a basket on your stall.
2. If Rosa sells 5 books for £2 each, calculate the total cost in pounds. Write your answer as a French sentence.

3. Explain why it is important to know the correct spelling of numbers when writing prices in a French market.
4. Compare the number 'quarante' (40) and 'cinquante' (50). Justify which number is greater and explain how you know.
5. What might happen if a customer asks for 'vingt' flowers but you only draw 'dix'? Justify how this would affect the transaction.
6. Create a new label for a hidden item on your stall using a number between 30 and 50. Write the number in French.
