

Rosa's Review Corner: Expressing Opinions in French

Learning objective: To use a range of French opinion phrases (J'adore, J'aime, Je n'aime pas, Je déteste) and justify them using simple connectives.

Rosa the parrot is creating a review board for her favourite hobbies. Help her complete the sentences by choosing the correct opinion phrase from the word bank, then add a reason using 'parce que' (because) or 'mais' (but). Use your imagination to finish each sentence in French.

Extension challenge: Write a short paragraph (4-6 sentences) in French titled 'Mes Goûts' (My Tastes). Include at least four different opinion phrases and use 'et' (and) or 'mais' (but) to link your ideas. What might happen if you used 'aussi' (also) to describe two things you like? Include this in your paragraph.
