

Rosa's Opinion Café: French Expression Drawing Sheet

Learning objective: To use French opinion phrases (J'aime, J'adore, Je n'aime pas, Je déteste) to express personal preferences about food and activities.

Help Rosa the parrot design her favourite café! Use the French opinion phrases in the word bank to label your drawings. You must show Rosa's feelings about each item clearly through her facial expressions or symbols (like hearts for 'j'adore' or a cross for 'je déteste').

Draw: Create a large, vibrant scene of the interior of Rosa's café. Divide the wall into four distinct sections. In each section, draw a clear illustration of one of the items from the word bank. Ensure Rosa the parrot is present in the scene, pointing to her favourite items with a happy expression and shying away from the items she dislikes. Use colourful, cartoon-style art with clear labels written in neat, legible handwriting next to each item.



Label words: J'adore (I love) · J'aime (I like) · Je n'aime pas (I don't like) · Je déteste (I hate) · le chocolat (chocolate) · les pommes (apples) · le football (football) · la lecture (reading)

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a plate of food Rosa loves. Label it using 'J'adore' and the correct French noun.
2. Step 2: Draw an activity Rosa dislikes. Label it using 'Je déteste' and the correct French noun.
3. Explain why it is important for a café owner to clearly communicate their preferences to their customers

using descriptive language.

4. Compare and contrast the intensity of the phrases 'J'aime' and 'J'adore'. Justify why a speaker might choose one over the other.

5. What might happen if Rosa accidentally labelled her 'Je déteste' food as 'J'adore'? Describe the confusion this could cause.

6. Create a new French opinion phrase for something you feel 'indifferent' about (neither like nor dislike).
