

Rosa's French Market Adventure

Learning objective: To use French vocabulary related to shopping for food and prices while demonstrating an understanding of quantities and currency.

Follow the drawing prompt to create your own French market stall. Once your scene is complete, use the vocabulary in the word bank to label your items and complete the written challenges below.

Draw: Draw a vibrant French market stall scene. Include a wooden table covered with a striped cloth. On the table, draw at least four different types of food (such as fruit, vegetables, or bread). Next to each item, draw a small sign showing a price in £. Include Rosa the parrot standing behind the stall wearing a small apron. Use a bright, colourful style and ensure there is enough space around your items to add your French labels.



Label words: une pomme (an apple) · un pain (a loaf of bread) · le prix (the price) · combien ça coûte? (how much is it?) · un kilo (a kilogram) · une pièce de monnaie (a coin)

Steps:

1. Label three items on your market stall using the French words from the word bank.
2. If an apple costs £0.50, calculate the total cost for 4 apples. Show your working out.
3. Explain why it is important for a shopkeeper to display prices clearly for their customers.
4. If a customer hands you a £5.00 note for an item that costs £3.75, calculate the change you must give

back.

5. Compare and contrast shopping at a market stall versus a large supermarket. Justify your preference.

6. What might happen if you miscalculated the change for a customer? How would you resolve this politely in French?
