

Rosa the Parrot's French Verb Challenge

Learning objective: To identify and use common French verbs in the present tense (first person and third person).

Hello! I am Rosa. Let's look at our French verbs. Read each question carefully. Use the word bank if you get stuck. Write your answers on the lines provided.

Rosa the parrot says: Remember, in French, the verb ending changes! 'Je' usually ends in '-e'. 'Il' or 'Elle' also ends in '-e'.

Word bank: je (I) · il/elle (he/she) · mange (eats) · joue (plays) · regarde (watches) · aime (likes) · habite (lives)

2. Complete the sentence: 'Je _____ au football.' (I play football). Use the word bank. (2 marks)

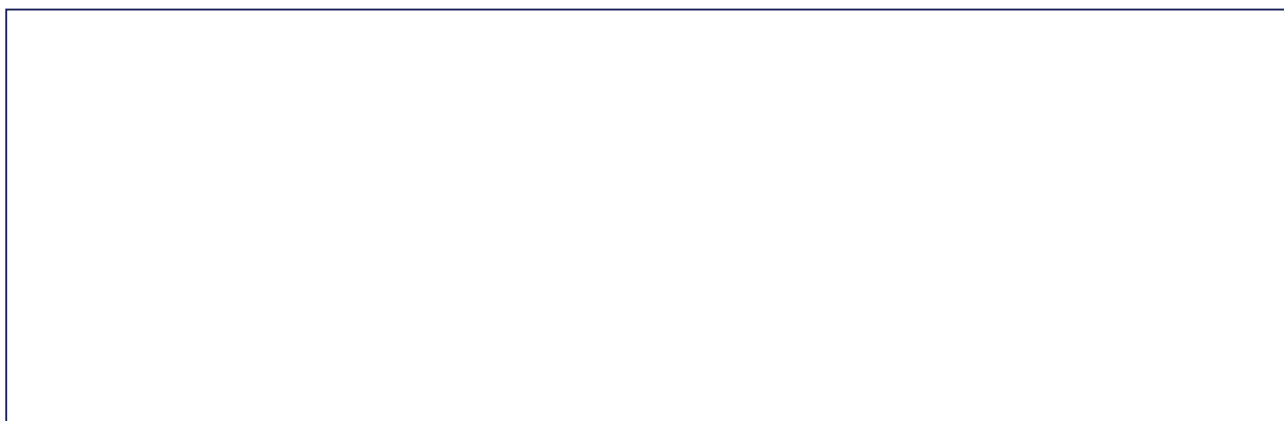
3. Complete the sentence: 'Elle _____ une pomme.' (She eats an apple). Use the word bank. (2 marks)

5. Explain in your own words: What letter do most 'Je' verbs end with in French? Give one example. (4 marks)

6. Extended Writing: Write three short sentences in French about what you like to do. Use: Je + [verb]. For example: 'Je joue.' (5 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of yourself doing something you like. Label it with 'Je' and a verb from the word bank.
