

Rosa's French Verb Adventure!

Jump into French! Learn how to change your verbs with Rosa the Parrot.

- The word 'Je' means 'I'. When we talk about ourselves, we add an 'e' to the end of most 'er' verbs.
- The word 'Tu' means 'you'. When we talk to a friend, we add 'es' to the end of the verb.
- The words 'Il' and 'Elle' mean 'he' and 'she'. We add an 'e' to the end of the verb for them.
- Verbs are action words. In French, the verb changes shape depending on who is doing the action.
- The 'Présent' tense tells us that the action is happening right now, like 'Je danse' (I am dancing).

Did you know? Did you know? In French, many verbs end in 'er' when they are in their base form, which is called the infinitif. When we use them in a sentence, we chop off the end and add a new ending to match who is speaking!
