

## Quel temps fait-il ? (What is the weather like?)

Join Rosa the Parrot on a flight across the French skies—master the weather in no time!

- To ask about the weather, we say: 'Quel temps fait-il?'
- When the sun is shining brightly, we describe it as 'Il fait du soleil'.
- If you see clouds and droplets, you can say 'Il pleut'.
- To describe a chilly day, use the phrase 'Il fait froid'.
- For a lovely, clear day, we simply say 'Il fait beau'.
- If the wind is blowing, we say 'Il fait du vent'.

*Did you know? Did you know? Even though France is a large country, the weather varies significantly from the sunny Mediterranean coast in the south to the cooler, mountainous regions of the Alps in the east. Rosa the parrot always checks the 'météo' before planning her flight paths across Europe!*
