

# La Météo: Mastering French Weather Phrases

*Learning objective: To be able to describe the weather in French, use accurate vocabulary, and justify opinions regarding seasonal climates.*

Read each task carefully. Ensure your French spelling and accents are precise. For the written responses, aim to use full sentences.

Rosa the parrot is preparing her weather reports for her friends across France. She needs to ensure she is using the correct structures to describe the climate in different regions.

*Word bank: Il fait beau (It is beautiful weather) · Il fait mauvais (It is bad weather) · Il fait chaud (It is hot) · Il fait froid (It is cold) · Il y a du soleil (It is sunny) · Il pleut (It is raining) · Il y a des nuages (It is cloudy) · En hiver (In winter) · En été (In summer)*
