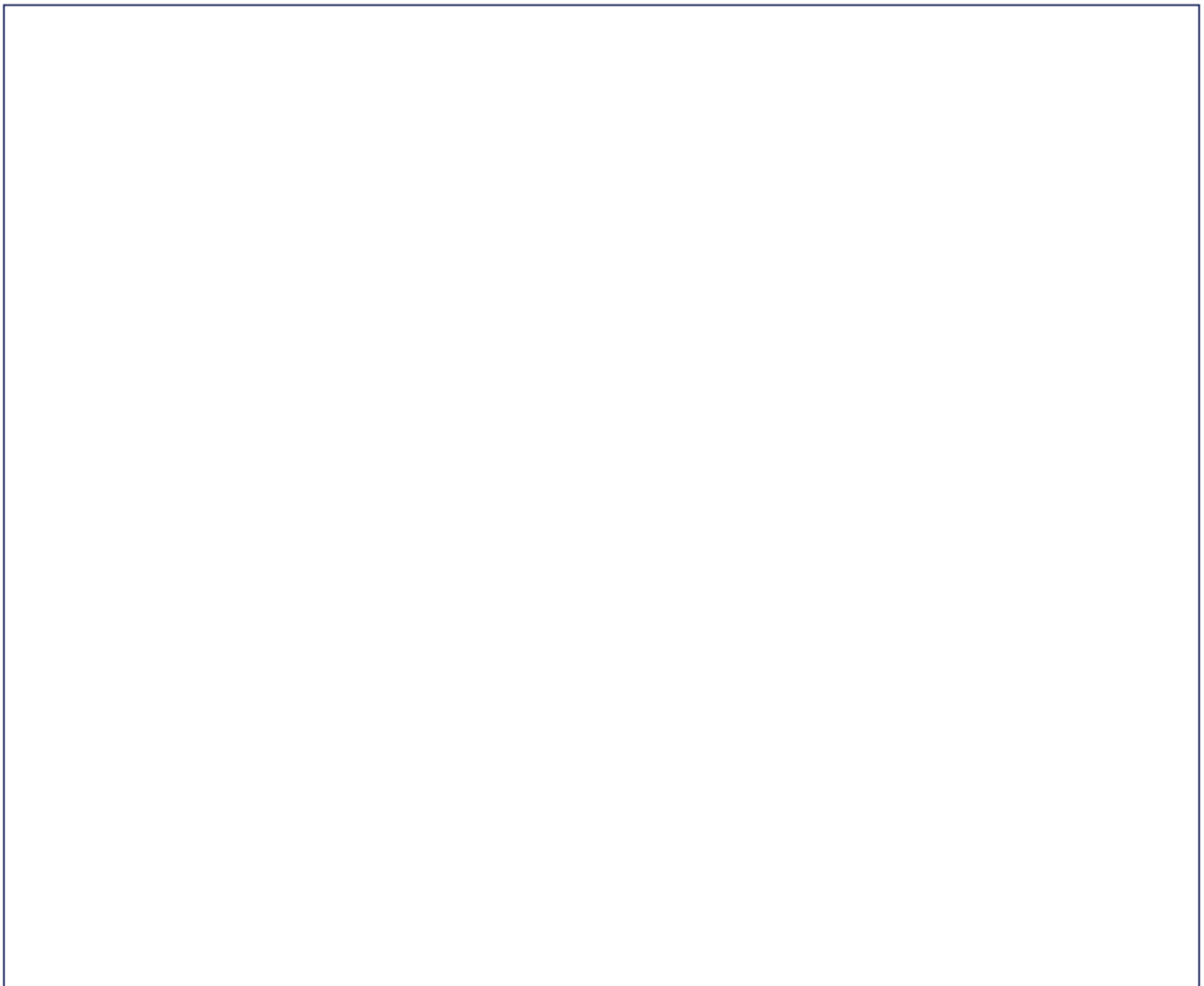


Finn the Dolphin's Coastal Adventure

Learning objective: To identify and draw key geographical features of a coastline.

Follow the steps below to draw a map of a coast. Use your best labels to show where the land meets the sea. Look at the word bank for help with your labels.

Draw: Draw a colourful scene of a coastline. Include a high, steep cliff on the left, a flat sandy beach at the bottom, and a headland jutting out into the blue sea. The scene should be viewed from above, like a map. Use blue for the water, yellow for the sand, and grey or brown for the rocks.



Label words: beach · cliff · sea · bay · headland

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a tall, rocky 'cliff' on one side of your paper. Draw a sandy 'beach' next to it.
2. Step 2: Draw a large area of 'sea'. In the middle of the sea, draw a small 'bay' where the water curves into the land.
3. Step 3: Draw a 'headland'—this is a piece of land that sticks out into the sea.
4. Step 4: Use a pencil to draw a line pointing to each feature and write the correct label from the word bank.
