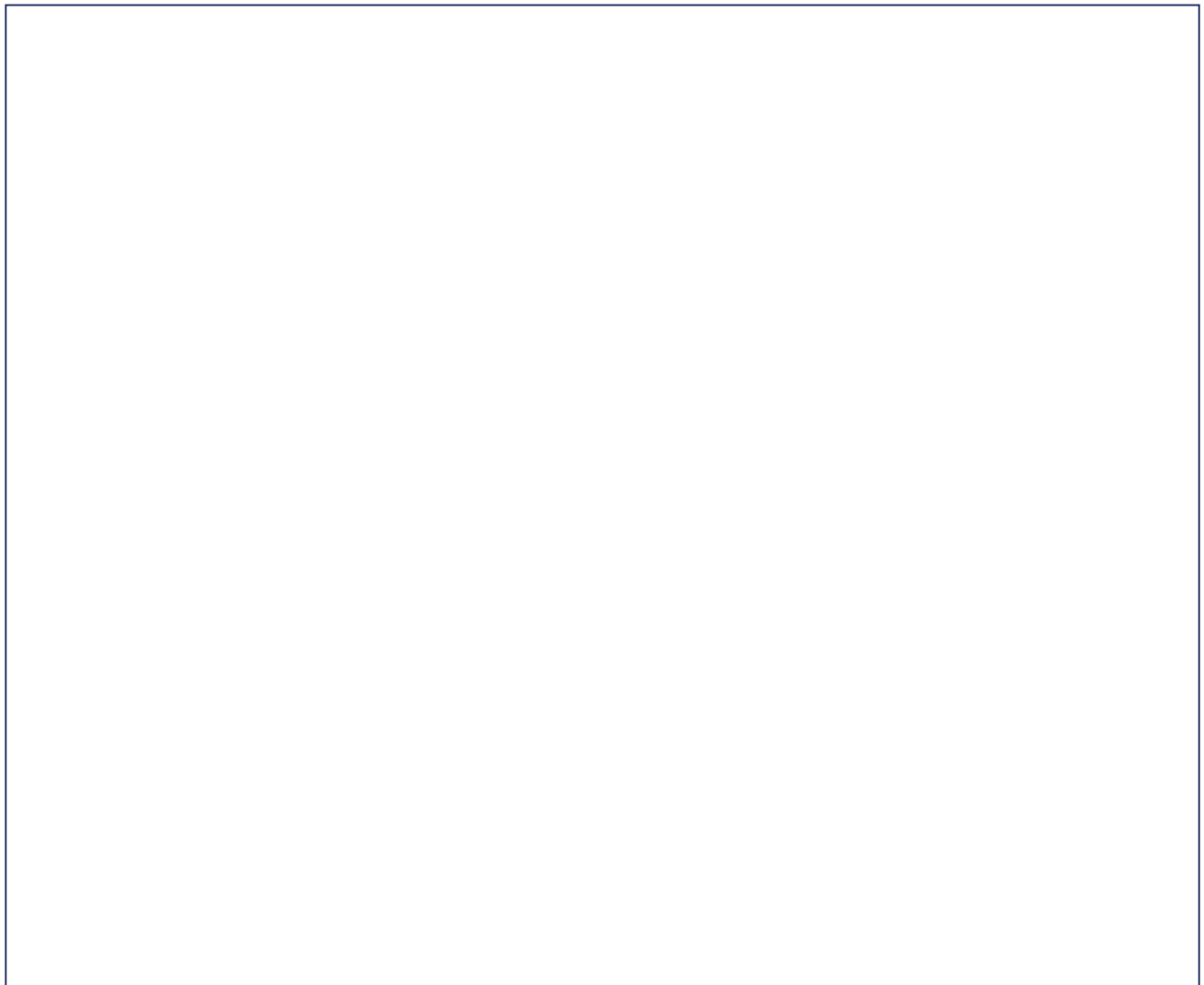


Exploring North America with Finn the Dolphin

Learning objective: To identify and draw key geographical features of North America.

Follow the steps below to draw a map of North America. Use the word bank to help you label your drawing. You can use colours to show different parts of the land.

Draw: Draw a large map of North America on your page. Use a blue pencil for the Pacific Ocean on the left and the Atlantic Ocean on the right. Use a brown pencil to draw the Rocky Mountains as small triangles. Draw a wiggly blue line for the Mississippi River. Make sure to clearly write the names of the places from the word bank next to your drawings.



Label words: North America · Rocky Mountains · Mississippi River · Pacific Ocean · Atlantic Ocean · Canada · USA

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw the shape of North America in the middle of your paper. Which two big oceans are on either side of it? Label them.
2. Step 2: Draw a line for the Mississippi River. Where does it start and end? Label it.
3. Step 3: Draw some triangle shapes to show the Rocky Mountains. Label them.
4. Step 4: Label the two largest countries on your map: Canada and the USA.
