

Neil Armstrong: The First Moon Walk

Learning objective: To understand the significance of the 1969 Moon landing and the historical impact of Neil Armstrong's achievements.

Read each flashcard carefully to learn about the life and mission of Neil Armstrong. Use these to test your knowledge of space exploration history.

Who was the first human to step onto the lunar surface?

Neil Armstrong became the first person to walk on the Moon on 20 July 1969.

What was the name of the spacecraft mission that landed the first humans on the Moon?

The mission was called Apollo 11, organised by NASA.

What did Neil Armstrong say as he stepped onto the Moon?

He famously stated, 'That's one small step for [a] man, one giant leap for mankind.'

Who were the other two astronauts on the Apollo 11 mission?

Buzz Aldrin, who walked on the Moon with Armstrong, and Michael Collins, who piloted the command module in orbit.

What was the name of the lunar module that landed on the Moon?

The lunar module was named 'The Eagle'.

In which specific area of the Moon did the Eagle land?

The landing site was a flat lunar plain known as the 'Sea of Tranquility'.

What was the 'Space Race'?

A intense period of competition between the USA and the Soviet Union to achieve superior spaceflight capabilities.

How did Neil Armstrong's career begin before becoming an astronaut?

He was a naval aviator and a test pilot who flew over 200 different types of aircraft.

What was the primary objective of the Apollo 11 mission?

To perform a crewed lunar landing and return safely to Earth, fulfilling a national goal set by the US President.

Why is Neil Armstrong considered a significant historical figure?

He represents the pinnacle of human exploration and technological advancement, marking the first time humanity visited another celestial body.

How much did the Apollo 11 mission cost in 1969 money?

The entire Apollo programme was a massive investment, with Apollo 11 alone costing approximately £200 million in 1969 currency value.

What happened to the astronauts after they splashed down in the Pacific Ocean?

They were recovered by the USS Hornet and had to undergo a period of quarantine to ensure they had not brought back any lunar germs.
