

Remembrance Day: A Time to Reflect

Learning objective: To understand the historical significance of Remembrance Day and why we observe the two-minute silence.

Read the passage carefully and answer the questions using evidence from the text. Use full sentences and clear explanations where required.

Each year on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month, the nation pauses to observe Remembrance Day. This date marks the end of the First World War in 1918, when an armistice was signed to cease the fighting. Ellie, who loves history, often reminds her friends that this day is not just about looking back at the past, but about expressing gratitude for the freedoms we enjoy today. People across the country wear bright red poppies, a symbol of hope that grew amidst the churned soil of the battlefields. During the formal ceremonies, a solemn two-minute silence is held. This quiet period allows us to reflect upon the immense sacrifice made by soldiers who lost their lives in various conflicts. By wearing a poppy and taking part in this silence, we ensure that the lessons of history are not forgotten. It is a time for quiet contemplation, honouring those who showed incredible courage during the darkest of times, and committing ourselves to a future defined by peace and mutual respect.

3. Explain why the two-minute silence is an essential part of Remembrance Day ceremonies. (3 marks)

4. What might happen if a nation stopped observing days of remembrance? Justify your answer. (3 marks)

5. Do you agree that wearing a poppy is the best way to show respect? Justify your opinion. (3 marks)
