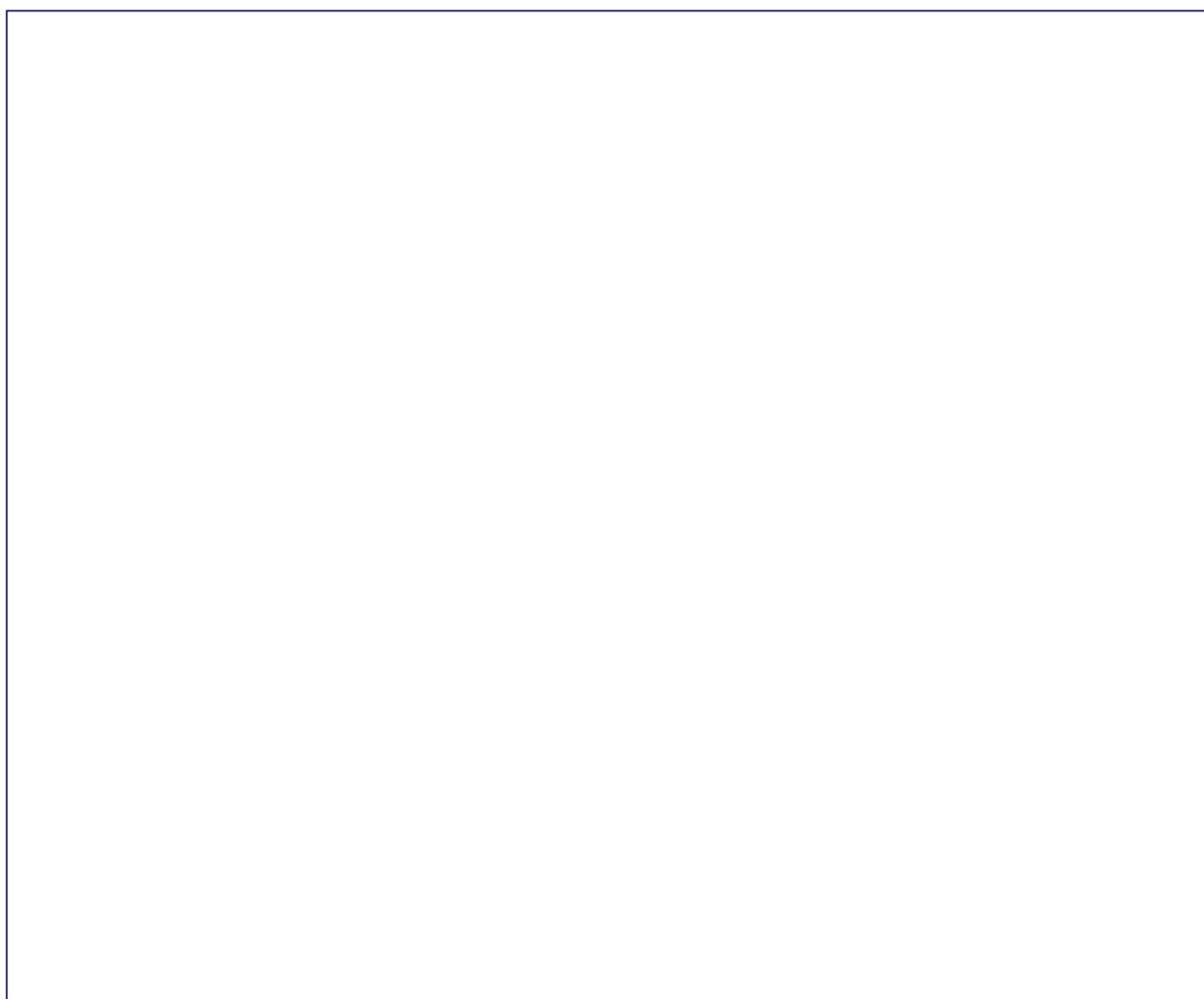


Max's Easter Market Maths

Learning objective: To apply addition and subtraction of money to solve real-world problems in a practical context.

Max the monkey is helping at the Easter Fair. Read the prices of the items below and follow the drawing instructions to complete your market stall scene. Use your maths skills to answer the questions about the items.

Draw: Draw a busy Easter market stall scene. In the centre, draw a table with a woven basket on top. Inside the basket, draw three decorated Easter eggs, a chocolate bunny, and a small spring flower. Around the table, draw Max the monkey looking happy with a clipboard. Ensure you label the items with their correct prices using the word bank provided.



Label words: Easter Egg £2.50 · Chocolate Bunny £1.20 · Easter Basket £0.75 · Spring Flower £0.50 · Total Cost

Steps:

1. Max buys one Easter egg and one chocolate bunny. How much does he spend in total? Show your working.
2. If Max pays with a £5.00 note, how much change should he receive after buying an Easter egg (£2.50)

and a basket (£0.75)?

3. Which is more expensive: two spring flowers or one chocolate bunny? Explain how you know.
4. Draw an Easter basket in your scene and label it with the price £0.75.
5. If you bought one of every item on the list, what would the total cost be?
