

Max the Monkey's Market Stall

Learning objective: To measure lengths and record prices using pounds and pence in a real-life context.

Help Max the Monkey set up his fruit stall! Follow the steps below to draw your market scene, label the items, and solve the measurement challenges.

Draw: Draw a large wooden market stall with a striped canopy. On the stall, draw a large bunch of bananas, three round apples, and a tall pineapple. Place a ruler on the counter next to the bananas. In the background, draw Max the Monkey wearing a small apron, looking happy. Use bright colours and clear lines to make the fruit stand out.



Label words: centimetres · metres · price tag · ruler · length · total

Steps:

1. Max has a banana that is 15 centimetres long. Draw the banana next to a ruler. Label the length.
2. Max is selling apples for 20p each. If you buy 3 apples, how much do they cost in total?
3. Max wants to build a display shelf that is 2 metres long. If he has one piece of wood that is 1 metre long, how many more metres does he need?
4. Draw a price tag on one of your fruits showing a cost of £1.50.
5. Which tool would you use to measure the length of a table: a ruler or a pair of scales? Explain why.
