

Max's Magnificent Measurement Guide

Measure It, Master It! Join Max the Monkey on a mission to find the size of everything!

- **Length:** We measure short objects in millimetres (mm) and centimetres (cm), but we use metres (m) for longer distances like the length of a playground.
- **Mass:** To find out how heavy something is, we use grams (g) for light objects and kilograms (kg) for heavier items like a bag of potatoes.
- **Capacity:** We measure liquids in millilitres (ml) for small amounts and litres (l) for larger containers like a full water bottle.
- **Equivalence:** Remember that 1000 grams is exactly the same as 1 kilogram, and 1000 millilitres is exactly the same as 1 litre.
- **Tools:** Always choose the right tool for the job! Use a ruler for small lengths, a measuring tape for height, and a weighing scale to find the mass of an object.

Did you know? Did you know? If you laid 100 centimetres out in a straight line, you would have exactly 1 metre! Just like Max counting bananas, measuring helps us keep everything in perfect order.
