

Max the Monkey's Market Maths Assessment

Learning objective: To recognise, name, and use coins and notes, and solve simple addition and subtraction problems involving money.

Read each question carefully. Use your knowledge of coins and notes to help Max the Monkey solve his shopping puzzles. Write your answers clearly in the spaces provided.

Max the Monkey is visiting the woodland market. He has a small purse to buy fruit and toys for his friends. Help Max calculate the costs and count his money correctly.

Word bank: penny · two pence · five pence · ten pence · twenty pence · fifty pence · one pound · two pounds · total · change

1. Max finds a silver coin with the number '5' on it. What is the value of this coin? (1 mark)

2. Max wants to buy a banana that costs 10p and an apple that costs 5p. How much do they cost altogether? (2 marks)

3. Max has a £1 coin and a £2 coin in his hand. How much money does he have in total? (2 marks)

4. A toy car costs 20p. Max pays with a 50p coin. How much change should Max receive? Show your working out. (4 marks)

5. Zara the Zebra wants to buy a paintbrush for 30p. She has three 10p coins. Does she have enough money? Explain how you know. (4 marks)

6. Pip the Caterpillar is buying bookmarks for his friends. Each bookmark costs 5p. If Pip buys 4 bookmarks, how much will he spend in total? Use a number sentence to show your answer. (4 marks)

7. Max is planning a party. He has £10. He wants to buy a party hat for £2, a balloon for £1, and a cake for £5. Does Max have enough money to buy all three items? How much money will he have left over if he buys them all? Write a short sentence to explain your answer. (5 marks)
