

Max's Magnificent Money Guide

Master your money with Max the Maths Monkey – let's make every penny count!

- 1. Remember that 100 pence is exactly the same as £1. Always check your total!
- 2. When writing money in pounds, we use a decimal point to separate the pounds from the pence, like £2.50.
- 3. To find the total cost of two items, you must add the amounts together carefully using column addition.
- 4. When you pay with more money than an item costs, the amount you get back is called your 'change'.
- 5. Max loves to compare prices! Use the greater than (>) or less than (<) signs to see which item costs more.

Did you know? Did you know? The word 'penny' comes from an old word that meant 'pawn' or 'pledge'. Long ago, people used silver pennies to trade for food and items, and they are still the smallest unit of money we use today!
