3. If you have £1 and spend 40p, how much change do you get? A) 50p B) 60p* C) 40p D) 30p (1 mark)

4. True or False: 100 pence is equal to £1. (1 mark)

5. True or False: £5.00 is the same as 50 pence. (1 mark)

6. Max buys two notebooks for 75p each. What is the total cost in pounds? (Write the answer using the £ symbol) (1 mark)

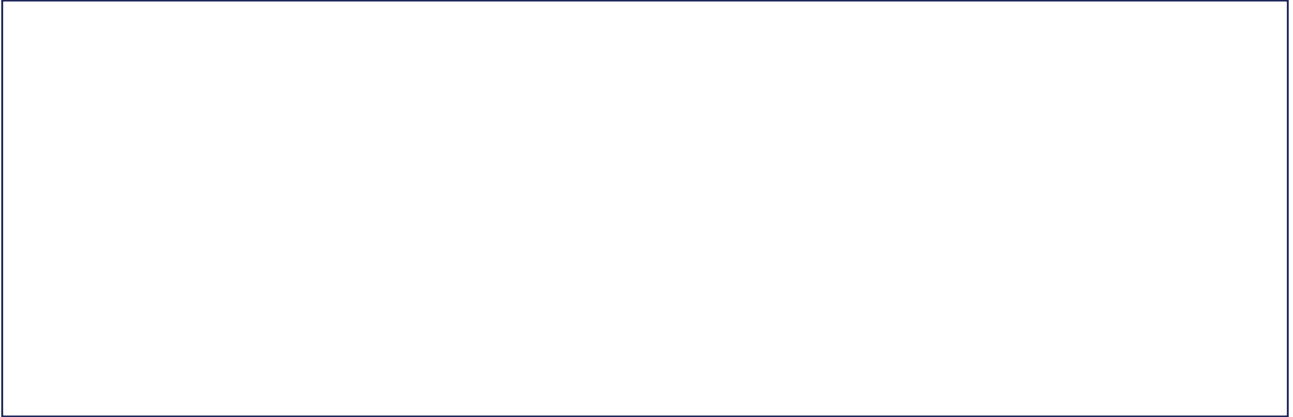
7. A box of berries costs £1.20. How much is it if you buy two boxes? (1 mark)

8. You have a £1 coin. You buy a pencil for 20p. How much change do you have left? (1 mark)

9. If three identical stickers cost 30p, how much would ten stickers cost? (Hint: Think about the cost of one sticker first) (1 mark)

10. True or False: £2.50 is more than £2.05. (1 mark)
