- A melody is the main tune of a piece, created by a sequence of notes that are pleasing to the ear.
- Tempo refers to the speed of the music; you can use Italian terms like 'Allegro' for fast or 'Adagio' for slow to direct your performers.
- Dynamics control the volume of your composition, shifting between 'piano' (quiet) and 'forte' (loud) to create emotional impact.
- Rhythm is the pattern of long and short sounds, acting as the heartbeat of your musical composition.
- Structure, such as A-B-A form, helps you organise your musical sections so the piece has a logical beginning, middle, and end.

Did you know? Did you know that musical notation is a form of 'musical map'? Just as explorers use maps to navigate the world, composers use staves, clefs, and notes to record their musical ideas so that musicians all over the world can perform their work exactly as intended!
